Parking Policy

Vehicles should be parked in garages, carports, or reserved spaces. Vehicles may be parked on the Associations streets for no longer than 72 hours after which time they are subject to be towed. Parking in the red fire lanes is always prohibited and your car will be towed without notice. If your vehicle is towed, call Rebelllo's towing at 408.292.8300

Note: If you are not using your vehicle, store it in your carport or garage. The Association's streets are not for vehicle storage.

Recycle Right!
Dispose of packing materials properly

Packages can arrive in a cardboard box, a paper envelope, padded envelopes and they often come stuffed with air pillows, packing peanuts or tissue paper. SanJoseRecycles.org has a comprehensive data base that is searchable to help decipher what goes where in San Jose.

Here is a quick reference guide:

Bubble wrap

Save to reuse for packaging, drop off at a local mail center for reuse, or deflate and place in the garbage.

Envelopes

Clean paper envelopes can be recycled even if they have a window, staples or tape on them. Do not recycle paper that has foil residue.

Padded envelopes

A padded envelope that says it is recyclable like a box can go in the recycling. A padded envelope with mixed materials, such as paper with bubble wrap inside will need to be separated so the bubble wrap goes in the trash.

Plastic air pillows

Save to reuse for packaging, drop off at a local mail center for reuse, or deflate and place in the garbage.

Packing peanuts

Drop off at a local mail center for reuse, or place in a plastic bag and put in the garbage.

Tissue paper

Put in the compost pile or in the garbage.

Cardboard

Clean cardboard can be recycled.
